In paragraph 6 of the Status Report filed by the respondent-Delhi Police, it has been stated that preserving the body for identification after conducting autopsy would result in amplification of decomposition and spread of decomposition to other bodies. In the Status Report, it has been further stated that autopsy shall be conducted within seventy-two hours.

2. Dr. Subhash Vijayran-petitioner, who appears through video conferencing, states that he is agreeable to the respondent's proposition that autopsy shall be conducted within seventy-two hours and the bodies shall not be unnecessarily preserved after the autopsy as it results in amplification of decomposition and spread of decomposition to other bodies



3. Recording the aforesaid and holding the respondent-Delhi Police bound by its Status Report, the present Public Interest Litigation is disposed of.
